




The VPA has been involved with the planning, siting and design of Local Town Centres (LTCs) for more than a decade.









The critical role of Local Town Centres (LTCs):

- LTCs provide a fundamental service to and are symbolic of their local community
- They need to be attractive for businesses to invest in and for people to work, shop and visit
- They set the locational identifiers, character and image of a neighbourhood

 for local residents, businesses, community organisations, visitors and wider Melburnians



Local Town Centre Definition:

Local Town Centres are an important community focal point:

- With a mix of uses to meet local needs and provide local jobs;
- Able to accommodate a supermarket and have access to a primary school;
- Other uses include office and commercial space;
- Accessible to a viable population by walking, cycling, local bus services and public transport links to one or more major town centres; and
- The heart of the LTC is public space or Town Square.
- Typical Population of 8000 10000 people



The VPA's current **Local Town Centres Program** reflects the of the role of the VPA as it takes on the tasks of planning:

- Growth Areas;
- Urban Renewal;
- Established Areas;
- National Employment and Innovation Clusters (NEICs); and
- Regional Areas

Town Centres Status as of October, 2017

- In the Greenfields we have completed planning for 62 Centres including 7 Major Town Centres, 32 Local Town Centres and 23 Local Convenience Centres
- In the Greenfields we are currently* planning for 57 Centres including 15 Major Town Centres, 33 Local Town Centres and 9 Local Convenience Centres

Town Centres Status as of October, 2017

- In the National Employment and Innovation Clusters (NEICs) we are currently planning 3
 Town Centres
- In our Urban Renewal Projects we are currently planning 4 Town Centres
- In our Regional Projects we are currently planning 6 Town Centres



"A City of 20 Minute Neighbourhoods":

The <u>local</u> nature of <u>Local Town Centres</u> supports the concept of <u>A City of 20</u>

<u>Minute Neighbourhoods</u>, when neighbourhoods are designed to be walkable and bicycle friendly and LTCs are strategically located.

Getting the mix of retail, community and other services is crucial to their success.



Local Town Centre 10 Key Principles:

Through research and application in the planning and design process, the VPA has developed **10 key principles** for the location, design and development of Local Town Centres which support the 20 minute Neighbourhood and include:



Local Town Centre 10 Key Principles:

- 1. Provide every neighbourhood with a Local Town Centre as a focus of the community (~1 per sq mile)
- 2. Locate on a connector street intersection with access to an arterial road
- 3. Locate in an attractive setting so that most people live within a walkable catchment (80-90% within 1 km)
- 4. Provide a full range of local services including a supermarket
- 5. Focus on a public space as the heart and centre of the community



Local Town Centre 10 Key Principles:

- 6. Integrate local employment and service opportunities
- 7. Include a range of housing options
- 8. Design the Town Centre to be a pedestrian friendly and accessible by all modes of transport
- 9. Create a sense of place with high quality engaging urban design
- 10 Promote localisation, sustainability and adaptability



Typical components of new Local Town Centres

- Central public place / town square of 1,000 to 2,000 sqm represents around 5 to 10% of total land area of local town centre
- Retail component of around 6,000 to 8,000 sqm or more, being:
- Anchored by full line supermarket (>3,000 sqm)
- Supported by speciality shops of 2,000 sqm or more (around 15 to 20 shops), including focus on local food
- Commercial (non-retail) businesses of 1,000 to 2,000 sqm in total, with scope for future office space of 1,000 to 2,000 sqm
- Cafés / Tavern / Bar / Restaurant linking to the town square
- Health / medical centre, pharmacy and associated facilities
- Gym / Fitness centre
- Multipurpose community facilities
- Car parking for 300 to 400 cars
- A potential 'service business area' adjoining the local town centre
- Small Local Enterprise Precinct or SLEP



Typical components of new Local Town Centres

- SOHO (Small Office Home Office) 1000 2000 sq metres
- Medium and higher density housing
- Retirement centre / aged care
- Residential accommodation such as a motel / serviced apartments

Direct relationship with and accessible to

- Local primary school(s) government and non-government
- Secondary school (for approximately 1 in 3 Local Town Centres)



 a variety of passive and active recreation areas and facilities in the surrounding area




Local Town Centre Location Principle (No. 1 of the 10 Key Principles):

 Provide every neighbourhood with a Local Town Centre as a focus of the community (~1 per sq mile)










LTC and LCC spacings in some Western PSPs






