				Western Freeway Overpasses – Traffic Safety and Capacity		
				It is requested that the appropriate government body be engaged		
				to initiate planning and upgrades to the overpasses along the		
				Western Freeway between the Midland Highway and Howe		
				Street.		
				These overpasses already experience significant congestion during		
				peak periods, with right-hand turns when exiting the freeway		
				(Ararat-bound) becoming increasingly difficult and hazardous.		
				With the anticipated increase in population resulting from the		
				Ballarat North development, failing to upgrade this infrastructure		

will likely lead to higher traffic volumes, increased collision risks, and greater danger to motorists and pedestrians alike. Early intervention and planning for these upgrades are essential to ensure community safety and maintain efficient traffic flow.

2. Increased Housing Density Adjacent to Miners Rest

The proposed zoning of higher-density housing along the boundary adjoining the Miners Rest community is inconsistent with the principles outlined in the Miners Rest Township Plan. The Township Plan emphasises larger lots and a rural character, and specifically notes that future development in Ballarat North should complement these values.

Given that the Ballarat North development will be visible from Miners Rest homes, it is requested that the current proposal for increased density housing along this shared perimeter be revised to Balanced Housing. This adjustment would align the development with the intent and character of the Miners Rest Township Plan and support a cohesive transition between the two communities.

3. Climate Change and Urban Heat Risk

The proposed development will introduce substantial new roads and infrastructure, while retaining only limited green space. It is therefore important to understand what Climate Change Risk Assessment has been undertaken for this project.

The Ballarat City Council has previously indicated the importance
